The patient appeared agitated on arrival. Blood pressure was high. Other indicators included further hair and weight loss. Patient informed that he had recently separated from his long-term partner, citing physical and emotional abuse. Defensive bruising across the arms and legs was still evident and typical of that from a heavy wooden instrument, such as a rolling pin or similar. Details of his latest job assignment and the ensuing burglary attempt are typical catalysts for such a condition.

Patient also cited respiration difficulties and has been prescribed Ventolin to take during attacks. Blood iron levels were low and patient has been told to improve his dietary intake, given vitamin supplements, encouraged to spend more time in natural daylight, and offered fibrous snacks to deal with his constipation issues.
